Using aerial imagery, he captures the impacts human activities have on Earth.</p>	<p>Olafur Eliasson's creates art in a variety of mediums including sculpture, painting, and architecture covering topics such as climate change and sustainability.</p>
<p>Naziha Mestaoui, artist and architect, uses space and imagery to immerse the viewer in unique experiences of realist art.</p>	<p>Rachel Sussman's work explores the intersection of time, science, and philosophy. One project that she's been working on for the last ten years is titled, "The Oldest Living Things in the World."</p>	<p>Gabriel Orozco works in multiple mediums to convey relationships, particularly fragile ones, between objects and people.</p>	<p>Mathilde Rousset builds "living sculptures." She creates her work with recycled metal and fabric, fills it with dirt, and then, plants seeds.</p>
<p>Agnes Denes is a pioneer of environmental art who uses the natural world and our relationship with it as the primary medium for her artwork. Her projects depict issues of human impact such as ecological decline and global hunger.</p>	<p>Asher Jay is an artist whose work includes ad campaigns, paintings, films, and animations. While she works in a variety of mediums all of her work has one mission: wildlife conservation.</p>	<p>Nils-Udo builds structures using natural, on site materials that highlight the difference between organic and inorganic components.</p>	<p>Andy Goldsworthy's works directly in the environment by rearranging natural materials he finds on site. Some of his works are permanent but others are temporary and fade with time.</p>
<p>Dr. Craig Santos Perez is an indigenous eco-poet and academic whose work has been featured internationally.</p>	<p>Wendell Berry is an Kentucky farmer and American author whose poetry, novels and essays explore ecological responsibility from a farmers perspective.</p>	<p>Robert Frost realistically evokes the New England landscape in his poetry, enabling readers to clearly picture an orchard in <i>After Apple-Picking</i>. He work has been praised for the way it captures nature's local truth.</p>
