NEW AGE OF EXPLORATION

One hundred and thirty years ago, 33 prominent figures from Washington, DC's scientific and intellectual circles gathered to consider organizing a society "for the increase and diffusion of geographic knowledge." Ten months later, the first issue of National Geographic magazine was sent to 200 members! More than 13,000 grants have followed, funding the ground-breaking work of explorers like Louise and Meave Leakey, Hiram Bingham, Jane Goodall, and Sylvia Earle. This exhibition focuses on the impact that the National Geographic Society has made on the world and how it has reported and reflected a dramatically changing planet.

Zoos worldwide are hosting Photo Ark. These exhibitions highlight important conservation work taking place in zoos, aquariums, and wildlife sanctuaries around the world. Each exhibition features large-format prints in 2.4 meters tall kiosks, as well as a grid of many more images to showcase the range of species in the Photo Ark. Opportunities are available to customize some of the kiosks for zoos where Joel Sartore has photographed.

BIRDS OF THE PHOTO ARK

Wild birds connect us to environments that are rapidly receding. They live in a spectacular variety of habitats and signal ecological health. To commemorate the centennial of the Migratory Bird Treaty Act, which protects more than 1,025 species, National Geographic Society has partnered with National Audubon Society, BirdLife International, and the Cornell Lab of Ornithology. Birds of the Photo Ark shows how our changing environment is leading to the dramatic disappearance of bird species around the globe. We also document how people can take action to protect our birds—and our environment. Of the nearly 8,000 species photographed for Photo Ark to date, nearly 2,000 are birds. This exhibition reveals the amazing variety of birds around the world.






CLIMATE CHANGE






RARELY SEEN

THE WORLD IN BLACK AND WHITE

This exhibition presents the work of 17 National Geographic photographers working between 1880 and 1950, selected from the photo archives. Through their travels, **CLIFTON R. ADAMS, J. BAYLOR ROBERTS, EDWIN L. WISHERD,** and **B. ANTHONY STEWART** recorded the lives of ordinary people from the 1920s to the 1940s. **DR. JOSEPH F. ROCK** documented the lives of Buddhists in China and Tibet. **VOLKMAR K. WENTZEL** took photos of African cultures. **GEORGE SHIRAS III** was the first to take night photographs of wildlife. **MAYNARD OWEN WILLIAMS** documented his travels in Paris and in India. **ALEXANDER GRAHAM BELL**, second president of the National Geographic Society, took photos of his early 20th-century flight experiments.

THE NEW FACE OF EUROPE

In collaboration with our partner, the Nobel Peace Center, National Geographic is traveling for the first time ever an exhibition of photographs and writings produced by National Geographic Photo Camp students in Europe. National Geographic photographers **MARCUS BLEASDALE**, **ROBIN HAMMOND**, **LYNN JOHNSON**, **PETE MULLER**, and **ANDREA BRUCE** mentored students in Athens, Greece, and three Norwegian cities during the Summer of 2017. The refugee youth who participated had journeyed to their new homes from Syria, Afghanistan, Iran, Somalia, Sudan, and Eritrea, among other nations. The exhibition will highlight the stories of students, who are a blend of refugee and host country youth in Norway and Greece. The exhibition is designed to weave a narrative of the experiences of displaced youth, as well as their connection to the Norwegian and Greek students who participated alongside them. Their writings express optimism, hope, and the shared dreams of young people around the world. This exhibition is co-curated by National Geographic and the Nobel Peace Center.
