Thank you for your interest in participating in the Grosvenor Teacher Fellow Program with Lindblad Expeditions and the National Geographic Society. We receive numerous applications annually so please recognize that the selection process is very competitive.

Applications must be received through our online system by **January 5**, **2018**, **at 11:59 pm Eastern**. Incomplete applications or applications submitted after the deadline or by any means other than our online system will not be accepted or considered. You can save your application and come back to it at any time before the deadline.

Due to the high volume of applicants, we are not able to respond to individual questions concerning the application. Applicants will be notified in mid-February 2018 of the selection panel's decision. A formal announcement of the 2018 Program class will be released on the National Geographic Education website in March 2018.

As an applicant, you are responsible for uploading the letter into our application system. We will not accept letters submitted separately.

VIDEO AND WRITTEN RESPONSE QUESTIONS

Applicants must have a proven dedication to geographic education in their teaching field and show promise of continued active engagement in the future. They must have plans to return to a classroom or teaching environment the year following their assigned expedition and demonstrate the ability to incorporate their experiences into their teaching.

Applicants will be judged based on:

- 1. Their proven understanding of geographic literacy** and their ability to teach about the world.
- 2. Their vision for using this experience in a transformational way that positively impacts their students, peers, and local community.
- 3. Their willingness, ability, passion, and creativity to bring back what they learned on the expedition and apply it in meaningful ways.

**To National Geographic, being geographically literate means understanding the interconnected systems in the human and natural worlds and applying that knowledge toward sustainable actions.

Video Response Question: Introduce Yourself!

In a 1-3 minute "talking head" style video, tell us why we should select you for this program. Let us know why you are passionate about teaching about the world. Tell us what makes you, your teaching, and your community unique and how your students will benefit from your experience as a fellow. (Due to the number of applications we receive, the review committee will not watch more than 3 minutes of video per applicant. Please ensure your submission does not exceed the 3-minute mark.)

Please do not include any footage of your students or others. Speak clearly and directly into the camera, and feel free to use notes. Pretend you are talking to a room full of friends. We are not looking for technical skills or visual storytelling talent in this video—you are welcome to use a cell phone camera. This is our chance to get to know you!
