Presenting Groups: Identify and describe key stakeholders that would be involved in the solution to your animal migration impact. Use the *Sample Stakeholder Descriptions* handout for guidance. Your stakeholder descriptions should be written in the first person.

Stakeholder (Listening) Groups: Find the page for your assigned stakeholder. Read your stakeholder's accompanying description. As you listen to the presenting group's argument, think from your stakeholder's perspective about whether or not you think their recommended solution should be implemented. Then, circle whether you (the stakeholder) approve the recommended solution, reject the solution, or require revisions before the solution can be implemented. Finally, you must provide reasoning to support your decision. Your stakeholder reasoning will be part of the presenting group's assessment. However, if the reasoning for your stakeholder's decision is not evidence-based and fair (e.g., your reason is, "because I think so"), then your decision will not count. Make sure your reasoning is strong!
