### Seasons

A <u>season</u> is a period of the year <u>distinguished</u> by special <u>climate</u> conditions. The most <u>familiar</u> seasons are winter, spring, summer, and fall. However, many cultures also have a <u>monsoon</u> season, and still others only recognize rainy seasons and dry seasons.

Seasons occur because Earth is tilted on its axis as it rotates around the sun. Earth's axis is an invisible line that runs through its center from pole to pole. Places near the Equator experience little seasonal variation. They have about the same amount of daylight and darkness throughout the year. The angle of the sunlight also does not change much, so these places remain warm year-round.

Equator	noun	imaginary line around the Earth, another planet, or star running east-west, 0 degrees latitude.
familiar	adjective	well-known.
monsoon	noun	seasonal change in the direction of the prevailing winds of a region. Monsoon usually refers to the winds of the Indian Ocean and South Asia, which often bring heavy rains.
pole	noun	extreme north or south point of the Earth's axis.
rainy season	noun	time of year when most of the rain in a region falls.
rotate	verb	to turn around a center point or axis.
season	noun	period of the year distinguished by special climatic conditions.

seasonal variation	noun	differences in temperature, climate, and weather between seasons of the year.
